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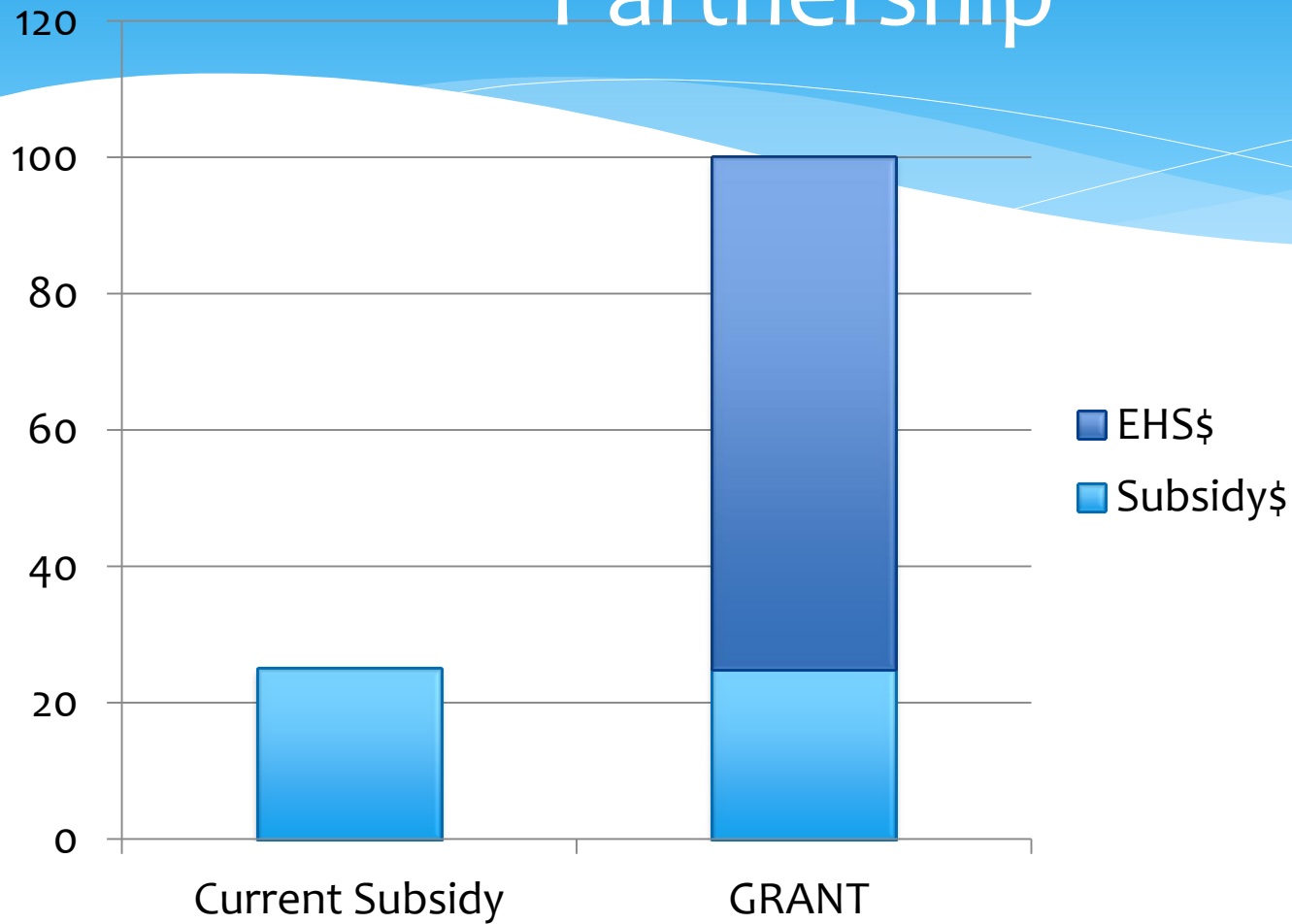


Early Head Start Child Care Partnership

- * **NEW** Federal funding opportunity
- * \$500 million will be available through competitive funding opportunities in all states, territories, tribes and migrant and seasonal communities for new Early Head Start/Child Care Partnerships.
- * These will be new 5 year grants, with a new grant number.
- * **FOA Funding Opportunity Announcement** is expected in spring 2014, which will be paneled over the summer, and awards must be made by **March 31, 2015**.

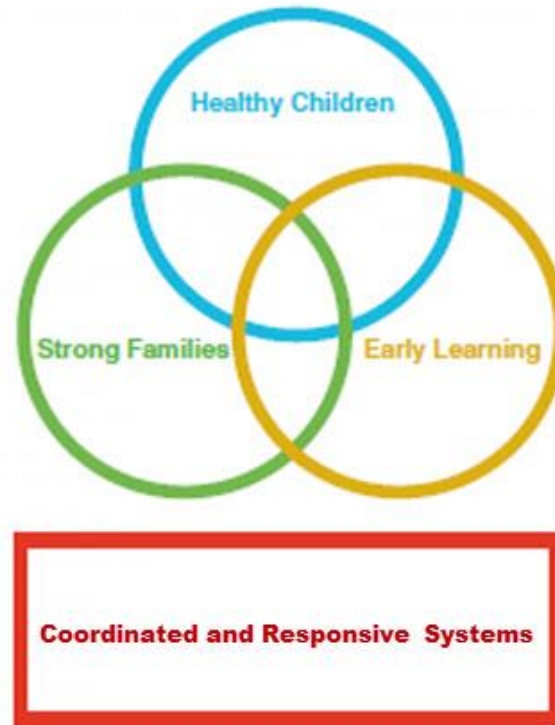


Early Head Start Child Care Partnership

- * These new federal grants will fund full-day, full-year, birth to three year old Early Head Start services in ***child care centers*** and ***family child care homes***.
- * The intent is to raise ***quality*** of infant-toddler care across the nation to positively impact child outcomes.

Snapshot of Early Head Start in NY

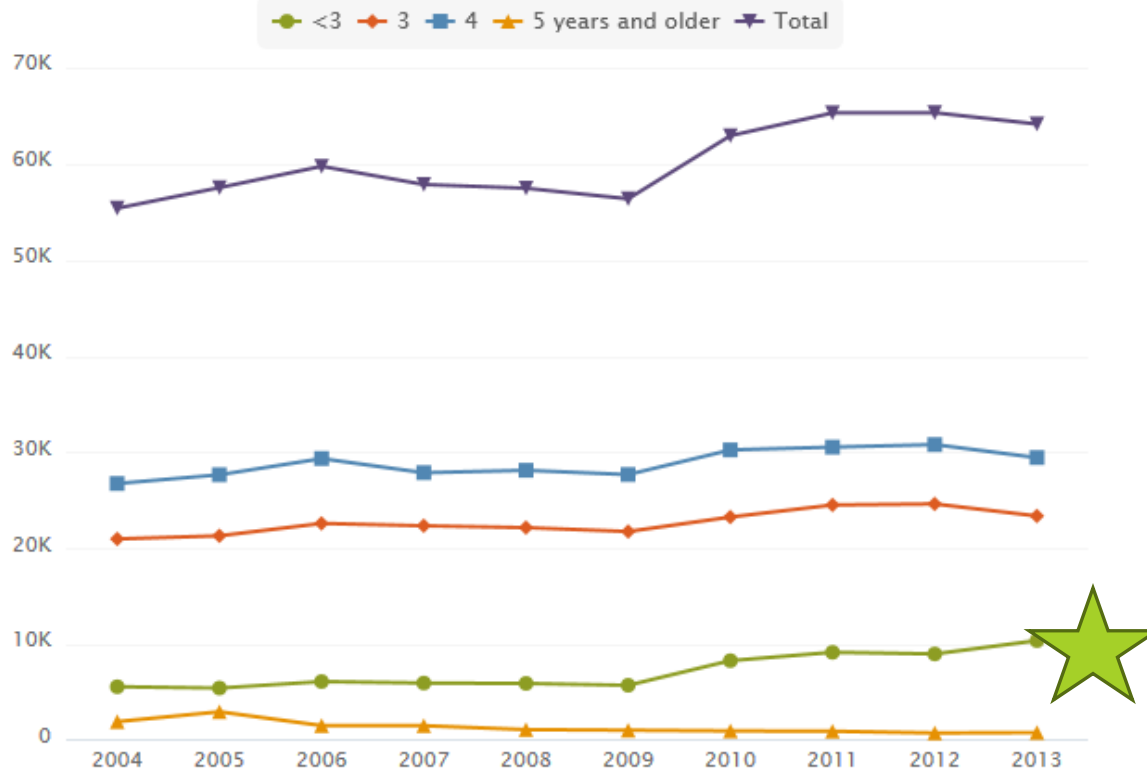
Most EHS programs are serving the children in a **homebased** or **combination model**.
